SPEAKERS

DAVID LAMBERT, NEHGS

David Lambert has been on the staff of NEHGS since 1993 and is NEHGS' Chief Genealogist. David is an internationally recognized speaker on the topics of genealogy and history. His genealogical expertise includes New England and Atlantic Canadian records of the 17th through 21st century; military records; DNA research; and Native American and African American genealogical research in New England.

Paul Howes, Guild

Paul Howes is chairman of the Guild of One-Name Studies and lives in Florida. With a cousin, he founded howesfamilies.com in 2008 and has since built a database of over 100,000 people in reconstructed families as part of his one-name study. A recovering actuary and former partner in a global consulting firm, Paul has given presentations on both sides of the Atlantic on one-name studies and his own study.

LOCATION

The *Guild Comes to Boston Seminar* will be held at the NEHGS Research Center (library and archive) located at 99-101 Newbury Street in Boston, Massachusetts. The facility is ADA compliant. Some limited parking is available and NEHGS is located within walking distance of the subway system (the "T"). Please visit the NEHGS website for an <u>overview of their facility</u>, as well as their <u>online records</u> and <u>library holdings</u> available for research. Wi-Fi access and access to online databases is available to all Seminar participants in the NEHGS conference room and library.

Costs

The Seminar cost is \$80 and includes 4 lectures, together with admission to the research library, continental breakfast, lunch, and afternoon coffee/tea both days.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

One-on-one consultations are available with either NEHGS staff or Guild representatives by prior arrangement at an added cost of \$20 for a 20 minute session. There are 12 slots available with NEHGS and 12 slots available with Guild.

All participants will receive a copy of **Seven Pillars**: **The Art of One-Name Studies**, an outline for each lecture, a resources handout, and a Guild USB drive.

Special subscription rates will be made available to any participants who join either the Guild or NEHGS during the seminar.
